- 2. Students are required to take at least 5½ credits per year. Students are encouraged to take six (6) classes per semester, and they are permitted to take seven (7) classes per semester. Students must follow the teacher's recommendation.
- 3. AP, dual enrollment, and honor level classes will be scheduled according to student qualifications and teacher recommendation for the particular class. These courses may require special applications. See your counselor if you have questions.
- 4. Some choirs and bands are chosen through auditions with the band and choir directors.
- 5. Service is working in the Main Office, Guidance Office, LRC, Athletic Office, Audio Visual, Attendance Office, or Career Tech Office. Students should contact that particular office if they wish to work during a study hall.
- 6. Students may drop a full year or semester course before the end of the 3rd week of classes. Courses dropped after the deadline will carry a final grade of 'F'. All schedule change requests for elective subjects must be submitted during the first three (3) school days of the school year/semester.

It is the student's responsibility to verify his/her schedule before school dismisses in the summer. If there are any corrections, these should be done prior to the last day of classes in May or before school begins in the fall. Counselors are available two weeks after school is out in the May and two weeks prior to school opening in the fall.

7.	A student athlete should review his/her schedule to ensure he/she is taking at least five (5), one credit courses or the equivalent. It is recommended that each student athlete carry six courses per semester that count toward athletic eligibility.
