
All students K-4 engage in district-wide assessments throughout the month of April, into early May. As always, please ensure your student is in attendance regularly!

As you know, each month we are working to include in our building newsletter tips for parents on talking with and supporting their children. This month, we want to focus on helping your child recognize when something is hard and work through it. As adults we all know the most rewarding experiences in life often involve significant struggle and sacrifice at some stage. Things like being married, being a parent, staying healthy are all things we have to work hard at. So, helping our students understand why learning to work through something they might be struggling with, is so important. Here are some ideas:

- Help your child become curious about errors or lack of success.

- Help your child become curious about errors or lack of success Remind your child that failure is important on the way to success. Model this!
- Show your child the Michael Jordan Failure commercial www.youtube.com/watch?v=45mMioJ5szc Talk to your child about what the last line of the video means.
- Provide some puzzles and games that may create a little struggle for your child. Work together and discuss why struggle shows that you are learning and that you can build resiliency.
- Model and encourage resiliency-the ability to bounce back from errors and failures.

General Housekeeping...

- Another batch of our form letters regarding attendance will be coming out soon. This is part of our policy at Perry Local Schools.
