Perry High School is excited to begin the second year of having all four high school classes in the building, and we especially look forward to each Senior class. The class of 2013 will not see many changes to our building compared to a year ago with the addition of our new cafeteria and freshmen wing, but we continue to update our technology, which is not always so visible. One very visible upgrade was remodeling to accommodate our growing JROTC program. The improved space will effectively house this valuable lead by Major Dennis Marshall and Sergeant Eric Rouse. The JROTC program centers on providing students life long leadership training. Currently, there are 178 students enrolled in a Perry High School Dual Enrollment course. These students will be completing 1,462 college credit hours this year. From a state testing standpoint, we improved in every OGT subject. Our results were: Reading - 96%, Math - 93%, Writing - 95%, Science - 88%, and Social Studies - 92%. These numbers reflect the hard work and dedication of all staff and our students.

PERCUSSION ENSEMBLE MAKING NOISE

The Perry High School percussion ensemble has been chosen to perform at the 2013 OMEA music educators convention in Columbus, Ohio Feb. 7-9. To get selected the ensemble had to audition with three songs of different styles. Over 130 groups auditioned for this occasion. This is the second time the percussion ensemble has been chosen for this honor. The last time was in 2007.

What an amazing summer! PHP has been very busy this summer working on our many projects! With the help of our community members, churches, and businesses we have been able to do the following:

Backpacks- PHP, Perry Christian Church, Whipple Heights C&MA, Richville United Church, and Annie's Latte da worked together to collect and pack over 100 back packs with basic school supplies for our students in need in grades K-6.

Clothes Closet- Our clothes closet held its grand reopening in June at Richville United Church of Christ on Richville Dr. We are thankful to church members for allowing us to utilize their space to help Perry residents. The new clothes closet is opened every Monday from 10am-2pm and the fourth Friday of the month from 4pm-6pm.

Gardens- While we may not have the rain we need, the dedication we have is overwhelming. Brett Hunstman and Trinity United Methodist Church and several member of Richville United Church of Christ have given their time and talents to starting and maintaining garden's for PHP. Their combined efforts will allow us to offer fresh produce over the next few months at our food pantry.

Summer Lunch- One of the new programs we started this year was our summer lunch program. Working with R.U.C.C., Whipple Hts C&MA, and Life hope church (on Wales Ave.) we provided a few Perry low income developments with an opportunity to receive a sack lunch 3 days a week. These lunches provided each child with a sandwich, chips, fruit, drink, and a small treat. We averaged around 40 lunches per day!

Christmas Voucher Program- Yes we said Christmas! While the weather may be too hot to think of Christmas time our PHP elves have been hard at work preparing for this year's Christmas voucher program. We have scheduled several events to raise money to purchase gift cards for our children this holiday season.
